

The New Mirror Tee Enables the Tee and Golf Ball to Lean Forward Up To 17 Degrees For Longer and Straighter Ball Flight

As you might imagine, I constantly see or hear about the newest and greatest golf gadgets and equipment. Some have merit and some — well let's just say, save your cash.

Recently inventor Mark Chantal contacted me about his new product called the Mirror Tee®. It sounded interesting enough, so I had him send a few samples for testing. Chantal says, "The Mirror Tee golf tee enables golfers of all abilities to hit the ball longer and straighter." Here we go again with another longer and straighter gadget.

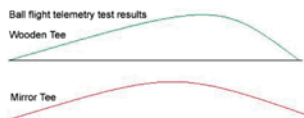
Chantal says, "The mirrored 45-degree foundation of the ball seat design provides a more stable and secure seat for the ball to rest on. This enables the tee and golf ball to be leaned forward up to 17 degrees, providing for longer and cleaner (zero friction) contact between the clubface and the golf ball, which results in a greater transfer of energy from clubface to ball — the golf ball goes farther!"

Now, I gotta tell ya, as I walked out on the tee box to tee a ball up on the Mirror Tee, I was thinking how the heck was I going to know when it was leaning 17-degrees forward? Surprisingly, common sense kicked in and after leaning the tee forward too much and the ball falling off, I finally found what I thought was a 17 degree forward lean. Kinda odd, but okay, I swung away and gave it a go. Fortunately, the swing was good and the ball rocketed straight down the middle of the fairway on a lower trajectory than I normally achieve. By the way, I could not get a golf ball to stay on a regular wood tee with the 17-degree forward lean. The fun part of this experiment was that the other players in my group were totally unaware that I was testing a new product. I wanted to avoid the inevitable ribbing I typically get when testing new golf gadgets. I was pleased that the ball never fell off the 17-degree tilt, or my longer and straighter tee secret would have been busted.

As the round went on, I continued to tee off with the same Mirror Tee from the first hole. I was impressed. I hit nearly every drive in the center of the fairway and on a more modest or boring trajectory than my typical high trajectory. In fact, I hit more fairways that day than I normally do. While I can't really say I hit it longer, I can say I played the same ball and tee throughout my round and hit the fairways — all of which adds up to a lower score.

The Mirror Tee is 3 and ¼ inches long — perfect for any size driver head.

How the Mirror Tee® XD17™ Golf Tee works — or, how physics apply to the Mirror Tee® to improve golf ball impact and flight:

When a golf ball is struck, it expands. It momentarily changing shape — bulging into an egg-like or oval, and then returns to its round shape shortly after leaving the clubface.

The Mirror Tee® XD17™ Golf Tee's patented mirrored 45-degree foundation ball seat design and hollow bore construction do two things: as the golf ball expands, the Mirror Tee's® hollow bore design vacuum pressurizes the tee (just like the effect you get when sucking on a straw) directly to the golf ball, dramatically reducing ball-spin rates. The ball flies straighter!

I do know that it really worked for me, and I'll continue to use this golf tee. Why don't you give it a try? If it works for you and you hit a few more fairways and greens in regulation, then it's worth its price. At the very least, I don't know how you could ever break one, so your tee will last forever.
